Get the facts:

According to the CDC's National Youth Tobacco Survey, 1 in 5 high school students reported used of vapes in the past month. The expectation is that growth will continue.

A current national survey result indicates that by the time they graduate high school, 45.5 percent of U.S. teens will have tried marijuana at least once. Marijuana is linked to school failure, lower income, and poorer quality of life, and to some mental illness.

Deaths from overdoses reached a staggering 100,300 in the 12-month period ending in April 2021. This represents nearly a 30% increase over the previous time period and was largely driven by fentanyl.
