Key Principles of the English Bill of Rights

- Ensured the authority of Parliament over the monarchy
- Required the monarch to summon Parliament regularly
- Gave the House of Commons the "power of the purse"
- The monarch could not interfere in parliamentary debates or suspend laws.
- Restated traditional rights of English citizens, such as trial by jury
- Abolished excessive fines and cruel or unjust punishments
- Affirmed the principle of *habeas corpus*
